Dear Mr. O'Bryant:


I wrote to the ASIJ Board of Directors on December 9, 2011 to urge you to be proactive in following up and taking responsibility for the Jack Moyer sexual abuse scandal. Specifically, ASIJ's board was urged to "publicly acknowledge that the school shares responsibility for past sexual abuse by its own staff during school programs, to thoroughly investigate and report on the causes and personal aftereffects, and to set a strong example in identifying and assisting victims and in helping other schools to learn from ASIJ's failures."

You did not reply. Instead I received a letter from Ed Ladd, Head of School, which stated among other things that you and Mr. Ladd had not been in your positions at that time. You cannot have failed to see that Mr. Ladd did not address the specific challenges which I gave the board. I have seen nothing in the Ambassador magazine or the school's e-mails that indicates that you have taken this seriously. I can only assume that the board and administration have decided to continue the cover-up of the Jack Moyer case that was begun by previous boards and administrations.

I attach my previous letter and urge you to reconsider your silence and apparent inaction. It can seem unfair that the previous boards have failed to deal appropriately with this case and that it ends up in your laps. However, the fact remains that the school has not fulfilled its obligation to deal with this publicly. It is now your responsibility.

I will conclude with the last paragraph from my previous letter: "Though much time has passed, there are still victims suffering from pain, guilt and anger, some of whom may not know that they are not alone in this. Sexual abuse has life-long consequences. ASIJ has a solemn duty to offer confidential assistance to all possible victims, and to help as many people and other schools as possible to learn from the lessons that the school learns through this process."
